Just one last word to you. Throw your minds forward for some years, and imagine the feelings of those who stood on one side indifferently at this present moment. I think that you would carry with you a feeling of shame and pain, as every man and every woman will who can only feel, when all this is over, that when the call came there was no response, and on the other hand, I can imagine that all those who are willing to sacrifice every effort, not waiting to be called upon but trying to find what they can do in their humble way, will carry with them in years to come a memory which will help to sweeten their lives to the very end.
