





VICTORIA CROSS

"For most conspicuous bravery, determination, and gallant leading of his command. The enemy attacked on the right of the battalion frontage, and succeeded in penetrating the Wood held by our men. Owing to successive lines of the enemy following on closely there was the gravest danger that the flank of the whole position would be turned. Grasping the seriousness of the situation Colonel Anderson made his way across the open in full view of the enemy now holding the Wood on the right, and after much effort succeeded in gathering the remainder of the two right companies. He personally led the counter attack and drove the enemy from the Wood, capturing twelve machine guns and 70 prisoners, and restoring the original line. His conduct in leading the charge was quite fearless, and his most splendid example was the means of rallying and inspiring the men during the most critical hour.

"Later on the same day in another position, the enemy had penetrated to within 300 yards of the village and were holding a timber yard in force. Colonel Anderson reorganised his men after they had been driven in and brought them forward to a position of readiness for a counter attack. He led the attack in person and throughout shewed the utmost disregard for his own safety. The counter attack drove the enemy from his position but resulted in this very gallant officer losing his life. He died fighting within the enemy lines, setting a magnificent example to all who were privileged to serve under him".



PREFACE

During the Great War many old boys of the Glasgow Academy served in the Imperial Forces, and a considerable number of these fell on the Field or died on Service. The late Major Peter Couper, O.B.E., T.D., who was for many years in command of the Officers' Training Corps, undertook the preparation of a Roll of Honour. The first edition of this was published in October 1918 while the War was still in progress. It was of necessity incomplete, but it was published as a nucleus round which might be gathered material for a complete and final edition. Unfortunately, while Major Couper was engaged in collecting the material for this final edition, his health broke down, and his sudden and unexpected death brought the work upon which he was engaged to an abrupt termination.

For some years no steps were taken in the matter, but the Governors of the Academy felt that it was their duty to have this work completed, and in 1929 appointed a Committee for this purpose. The task of revising and completing the Roll, so long after the event, has proved both difficult and protracted. The Committee are conscious that owing to the lapse of time, and the difficulty, in some cases, of tracing relatives, the records are probably incomplete or inaccurate in some respects.

The Roll covers the period from 4th August, 1914, to 11th November, 1918. It contains the names of 1469 former members of the School who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War. Of those who served, 316 fell on the Field or died on Service. In the Upper Gallery of the Academy their names are

"For most conspicuous bravery and resolution in the face of intense machine gun fire. During the initial advance he was shot through the right leg, but though crippled he continued to lead his men and captured the trench. In the captured trench Lieutenant Mackintosh collected men of another Company who had lost their leader and drove back a counter attack. He was again wounded, and although unable to stand he continued nevertheless to control the situation. With only fifteen men left he ordered his party to be ready to advance to the final objective, and with great difficulty got out of the trench and encouraged his men to advance. He was again wounded and fell. The gallantry and devotion to duty of this officer were beyond all praise".
